Holy Communion

In The United Methodist Church, all people are invited to receive Holy Communion. You do not have to be a member of this or any church. Our altar is not Cahaba Heights UMC's table or even a United Methodist table; it is the Lord's table. Therefore, anyone who desires more of God in his or her life and seeks to live in peace with his or her neighbors is invited to come forward. We also especially welcome children. We believe that you do not have to fully understand Communion (who among us fully understands God's grace?) in order to benefit from it.

If you are unable to come forward for Communion, please alert a host and we will bring it to you. If you would like to come forward but are unable to kneel, you are welcome to stand.

The Season of Advent

Today begins the season of Advent, a time in which churches throughout the world prepare for Christmas— the celebration of the birth of Jesus. The word "Advent" comes from the Latin word *adventus* which means "arrival" or "coming." We celebrate Advent for the four Sundays prior to Christmas. During this time we get ready for Christmas by reflecting on what it means to need and desire a Savior and what it changes to know that Jesus came into the world.


